

Week 10 (1st Qtr) Study Questions

1. In Numbers 19, why does God tell Moses and Aaron to sacrifice a Red Heifer and burn it and pour hyssop and cedar wood in to the fire? He also tells them to do what with the ashes? As the Israelites wanderings are coming to a close, what region do they end up in and who dies there? The people again complain because they have no water. What does God tell Moses to do to bring forth water and what does Moses actually do? What is the consequence of this?
2. What does Moses ask of the Edomites about their land? What is the Edomites response? The Israelites then travel from Kadesh to what Mountain? Moses anoints a new High Priest on the mountain and who is that? What happens to Aaron on this mountain?
3. What King then comes out to attack the Israelites? What happens to him and his army and his cities? The Israelites then start traveling around Edom and they start to complain again. So, God sends what into their midst? What does Moses do to relieve this situation? Two more kings come out against the Israelites, who are they and what was the name of their kingdom? Then they camp in what region? Who is the king of this region and who does he consult to try to curse the Israelites? What does this person do? What does God do to this person when this person tries to travel with the Moabites?
4. The Israelites begin to do what in the region of Moab? What happens to them because of this? A son of Eleazar does something to stop this, what does he do?
5. The Israelites are now on the verge of crossing the Jordan into the promised land, so God has them take a census all males over the age of 20. How many were counted amongst all the Israelites? In Numbers 26, 63-65, we read what about the people that were counted?
6. What does God institute for inheritances if a man does not have a son when he dies? Who does God tell Moses to appoint as the Israelites new leader to lead them into the promised land? How does he show this?

7. The Israelites next go to war with whom? God told Moses to recruit how many from each tribe to go to war with them? What happens when they go to war? After this, the leaders of 2 of the tribes ask if they can have the land east of the Jordan rather than crossing the Jordan and settling there, which tribes asked this and what conditions does Moses give for them to have this? What is their response?
8. What are the boundaries of the promised land for the Israelites to settle once they cross the Jordan? What land was to be given to the Levites? God tells them to set aside a certain number of cities as a city of refuge. What was a city of refuge and why did God ask Moses to designate them?
9. In Deuteronomy, Moses reminds the Israelites about all their wanderings and why that occurred and about the promised land from God? Why did God tell the Israelites not to meddle with the people in the land of Seir when they passed by them? Why did he tell them not to meddle with the people of Moab when they passed through the Wilderness of Moab? What were the first 3 cities that Moses set up as refuge cities? What does God tell them to do with the possessions of the conquered peoples when God gives them into their hands after they cross the Jordan? What does he tell them to do as far marriages and covenants with these people?

Stretch:

1. Deuteronomy 6: 5 says "You shall love the Lord your God with you're your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. " This verse is restated by Jesus in Matthew 22:37 in the New Testament. What does Jesus say about this commandment and did it have the same meaning in the Old Testament as it does in the New Testament? Hint: This command is at the heart of the matter!
2. When God tells Moses what to do to bring forth water and he does not follow God's command, it shows a certain attitude that came over Moses and thus he was not able to enter the promised land. Compare this to Numbers 12:3 and show how a man who is as humble as described in Numbers 12 could still be punished for a prideful moment.
