1 KINGS 17:17-24


The term famine literally refers to “an extreme scarcity of food,” but it can generically refer to any type of “great shortage.” The pandemic subjected many of us to a social famine, a medical condition can force us to face a health famine, and a family crisis can lead to an emotional famine. Such “famines” can dramatically and negatively affect your faith. In this series, we will examine the life of Elijah because his ministry coincided with a famine.
